How to Write a **Compare & Contrast** Paragraph: Japan and the United States – Population Density

When you are comparing and contrasting two or more things, you are explaining how they are similar (same or alike) and different (dissimilar or unlike).

Below is a list of common words one can use when comparing and contrasting two or more things:

<u>Compare</u>	<u>Contrast</u>
same	different
alike	unlike
like	on the other hand
both	but
also	whereas

Step 1: Create a good *hook* to catch the reader.

*Can you imagine...... (some interesting fact from the lesson) *Could you live in a house as small as your living? Well many people in Japan do!

Step 2: Write the topic sentence which lets the reader know what the paragraph is about- do <u>not</u> use the pronoun 'l'- "I am going to tell you about . . . " NO! NO! NO! "While the countries of Japan and the United States both have large populations, Japan's cities are much more crowded.
*Japan and the United States both have crowded cities; however there are some differences in how they deal with their high population density.

Step 3: **Compare** the population of both countries with two COMPLETE details about each. Be specific, don't just say "they're both countries, they both have apartments, etc."

*One way Japan and the United States are similar is . . . since they both . . . *Both Japan and the United States have . . . which means . . . *Like Japan which. . . ., the United States also . . .

Step 4: Write a transition sentence: lets the reader know you are moving to the differences:
 *Although there are similarities between Japan and the United States, there are also differences.
 *While Japan and the United States are similar, they are also different.

Step 5: Contrast the two climate regions you selected with two COMPLETE details about each. Again, be specific! Don't just say "Japan does this, but the US doesn't"

*In Japan . . . on the other hand, in the United States . . . *While Japan has . . . United States has . . .

Step 6: Write a concluding sentence or ending sentence that restates the topic sentence: *These are just a few of the similarities and differences between . . . *It is clear that there are many similarities and differences between . . .
